NOTICE TO CONTRACTORS

Sealed Bids will be received by the City of Belton, Missouri (Owner) at Parks & Recreation Offices, 16400 N. Mullen Road, Belton, Missouri 64012, until 2:00 pm, local time, June 16, 2011 for Oil Creek Greenway Trail, Phase 1 & 2.

At said place and time, and promptly thereafter, all Bids that have been duly received will be publicly opened and read aloud.

The proposed Work is generally described as follows:

Construction of approximately 450 feet of multi-use trail and retaining walls. Work also includes construction of RCBs and inlets and all appurtenant work as indicated in the Contract Documents. The project is generally located along Oil Creek between U.S. 71 Highway and 163rd Street in the City of Belton, Missouri.

All Bids must be in accordance with the Bidding Documents on file at the public plan room located on-line at: www.indoxservices.com. Bidders must fill out the on-line registration to request sets of plans. This information will be posted on-line for bidders and subcontractors convenience. A **nonrefundable** payment to InDox will be required.

Neither Owner nor Engineer has any responsibility for the accuracy, completeness or sufficiency of any bid documents obtained from any source other than the source indicated in these documents. Obtaining these documents from any other source(s) may result in obtaining incomplete and inaccurate information. Obtaining these documents from any source other than directly from the source listed herein may also result in failure to receive any addenda, corrections, or other revisions to these documents that may be issued.

This project requires compliance with the State of Missouri Prevailing Wage Law. The selected bidder agrees to abide by prevailing wage law for Cass County and the State of Missouri, and to compensate for work according to the current Annual Wage Order in effect at the time of the bid request. In cases of a discrepancy, the higher of the State v. Federal wage rate shall be used for compensation.

The prime contractor must perform with its own organization, contract work amounting to not less than 30% of the total original contract price. No second-tier subcontracting will be permitted on this project.

Non-MoDOT approved contractors may bid on this project; Section 102.2 of the Missouri Standard Specifications for Highway Construction, 2004 Edition will be waived for this project. DBE sub-contractors must be on the MRCC DBE Directory before bid opening.

The City of Belton hereby notified all bidders that it will affirmatively insure that in any contract entered into pursuant to this advertisement, minority business enterprises will be afforded full opportunity to submit bids in response to this invitation and will not be discriminated against on the grounds of race, color, or national origin in consideration for an award.

Each bidder shall furnish with the bid satisfactory evidence of Bidder's competency to perform the proposed work.

Bids will be received on a unit price basis.

Bid security must accompany each Bid. Each proposal shall be accompanied by a Bid Bond drawn on an acceptable bank, made payable, without condition, to the City of Belton, Missouri, in an amount of not less than 5 percent of the total proposal cost.

The Successful Bidder will be required to furnish a Construction Performance Bond and a Payment Bond as security for the faithful performance and the payment of all bills and obligations arising from the performance of the Contract.

No proposal may be withdrawn within a period of 60 days from and after the date fixed for opening proposals. If the Contract is to be awarded, Owner will give the Successful Bidder a Notice of Award within the number of days set forth in the Bid Form for acceptance of the Bid.

Missouri law, 292.675 RSMO, requires the awarded contractor and its subcontractor(s) to provide a ten-hour Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) construction safety program (or a similar program approved by the Missouri Department of Labor and Industrial Relations as a qualified substitute) for their on-site employees (laborers, workmen, drivers, equipment operators, and craftsmen) who have not previously completed such a program and are directly engaged in actual construction of the improvement (or working at a nearby or adjacent facility used for construction of the improvement). The awarded contractor and its subcontractor(s) shall require all such employees to complete this ten-hour program, pursuant to 292.675 RSMO, unless they hold documentation on their prior completion of said program. Penalties for non-compliance include contractor forfeiture to the City of Belton in the amount of \$2,500, plus \$100 per contractor and subcontractor employee for each calendar day such employee is employed beyond the elapsed time period for required program completion under 292.675 RSMO.

The City reserves the right to reject any or all proposals, and to waive any informalities or irregularities therein.
