Sealed proposals for the construction of the Sidewalks, Phase I for the City of Marshfield, will be received by the OWNER until 10 a.m. on Wednesday, August 17, 2011 at the City Hall, 798 South Marshall, where at that place and time said proposals shall be publicly opened and read aloud. Any bids received after such date and time shall be returned unopened.

"The **CITY OF MARSHFIELD, MISSOURI** hereby notifies all bidders that it will affirmatively ensure that in any contract entered into pursuant to this advertisement, businesses owned and controlled by socially and economically disadvantaged individuals will be afforded full opportunity to submit bids in response to this invitation and will not be discriminated against on the grounds of race, color, religion, creed, sex, age, ancestry, or national origin in consideration for an award." (Per Title V1 Civil Rights Assurances, EPG 136 10.8).

The charge for Plans and Specifications shall be One Hundred and 00/100 Dollars (\$100.00). No refund will be made.

The Proposal shall be accompanied by a certified or cashier's check drawn on a solvent Missouri bank or trust company made payable to the City of Marshfield, or a Bid Bond issued by a surety licensed to conduct business in the state of Missouri and appearing on the U.S. Treasury Department's most current list (Circular 570, as amended), in the amount of not less than five percent (5%) of the total bid. The Bid Bond may be retained by the City of Marshfield, as a guaranty that if the Proposal is accepted, the bidder will execute the Contract and file an

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acceptable Performance Bond and Payment Bond within fifteen (15) days after the award of the Contract.

This project will be advertised at least twenty-one (21) calendar days before the receipt of bids.

Bidders on this Work will be required to comply with the Copeland (Anti-Kickback) Act, and the Contract Work Hours and Safety Standards Act, as indicated in the Contract Documents.

The Contractor doing the work must pay for labor at rates not less than those certified pursuant to the U. S. Secretary of Labor in accordance with the Davis-Bacon Act and to Section 290.210-.340, RSMo. (1986) by the Missouri Department of Labor and Industrial Relations as indicated by the schedule included in the Contract Documents. The Contractor shall forfeit as a penalty to the City, Ten and 00/100 Dollars (\$10.00) for each workman employed, for each calendar day, or portion thereof, such workman is paid less than the said stipulated rates for any work under said Contract by him or by any subcontractor under him. Section 290.250.

Bidders on this work will be required to comply with the President's Executive Order No. 11246. The requirements for Bidders and contractors under this order are explained in the Specifications.

The award of Contracts on this project shall be predicated upon competitive bidding, with award being made to the lowest responsive, responsible bidder. Said lowest Bidders shall be determined for each Contract by summarizing the applicable low base bids and low base plus alternates bids. The "additive alternates" are items that will be selected if the "base plus alternates" price is within budget. The budgeted amount will be used to help determine which contractor the project will be awarded to. The Alternates are listed in priority order in the Bid Schedule with Alternate No. 1 being the highest priority. The Owner will award the project to the contractor who can provide the most amount of work (base bid plus alternate bids in priority order) that is within the Owner's budget.

All manufactured goods or commodities used or supplied in the performance of this work, or any subcontract thereto, shall be manufactured, assembled, or produced in the United States.

Any bidder or equipment supplier whose firm or affiliate is listed on the General Services Administration (GSA) publication entitled "Lists of Parties Excluded from Federal Procurement or Nonprocurement Programs" will be prohibited from the bidding process. Anyone submitting a bid who is so listed will be determined to be a nonresponsive bidder in accordance with 40 CFR 31.

The City of Marshfield reserves the right to reject any and all bids and to waive all informalities in the bids. No bids may be withdrawn for a period of sixty (60) days subsequent to the specified time for receipt of bids.
