MISSOURI SERVICE-DISABLED VETERAN BUSINESS PREFERENCE

By virtue of statutory authority, RSMo 34.074, a preference will be given all contracts for the performance of any job or service to service-disabled veteran business either doing business as Missouri firms, corporations, or individuals; or which maintain Missouri offices or places of business, when the quality of performance promised is equal or better and the price quoted is the same or less or whenever competing bids, in their entirety, are comparable.

Definitions:

Service-Disabled Veteran is defined as any individual who is disabled as certified by the appropriate federal agency responsible for the administration of veterans' affairs.

Service-Disabled Veteran Business is defined as a business concern:

- a. Not less than fifty-one (51) percent of which is owned by one or more service-disabled veterans or, in the case of any publicly owned business, not less than fifty-one (51) percent of the stock of which is owned by one or more service-disabled veterans; and
- b. The management and daily business operations of which are controlled by one or more service-disabled veterans.

If an offeror meets the definitions of a service-disabled veteran and a service-disabled veteran business as defined in 34.074 RSMo and is either doing business as a Missouri firm, corporation, or individual; or maintains a Missouri office or place of business, the offeror **must** provide the following with the proposal in order to receive the Missouri service-disabled veteran business preference over a non-Missouri service-disabled veteran business when the quality of performance promised is equal or better and the price quoted is the same or less or whenever competing proposals, in their entirety, are comparable:

1.1. Requirements – General

- 1.1.1. The contractor shall provide data cabling for the Department of Transportation (MoDOT) at various locations statewide, in accordance with the provisions and requirements specified herein. The contractor shall provide data cabling on an as-needed, if-needed basis: (1) on an “hourly work” basis, and/or (2) on a “data cabling project” basis as described below. The contractor shall understand and agree that MoDOT cannot guarantee any amount of services that may be required.
- 1.1.2. “Data cabling Service Calls” shall be defined as “Hourly work” as occasional assistance of one (1) or more persons on a temporary basis at various locations statewide.
- 1.1.3. “Data cabling Project” shall be defined as a project involving data cabling services during the agreement period that shall include but may not be limited to relocation, renovation, and/or installation of data cabling and telephone services. Services provided may include adding service/components to accommodate relocation, reconfiguration of existing data cabling, and providing testing and balancing associated data cabling in MoDOT buildings located in the specified counties.

1.2. Requirements – Performance

- 1.2.1. The contractor must provide qualified personnel to provide data cabling in a manner satisfactory to and acceptable by MoDOT.
- 1.2.1.1. Minimum contractor qualifications, certifications, and experience.**
- **Five (5) years of data cabling experience.**
 - **Possess licenses/permits required to perform telecommunications installations.**
 - **Contractor must be registered with BICSI and have at least one RCDD on staff.**
 - **Contractor must maintain a current Siemon Certified Installer (CI) certificate of good standing for the duration of the price agreement period.**
- 1.2.1.2. The lack of any minimum contractor qualifications, certifications, and experience stated in paragraph 1.2.1.1 may be sufficient justification for rejecting bids at the MHTC’s sole final discretion.
- 1.2.2. If and when a data cabling project is identified, MoDOT may notify the contractor of the general description of data cabling the project. The contractor shall agree and understand that data cabling projects may include but not necessarily be limited to, any of the services described in the general requirements and/or any of the following types of work.
- Install category 3UTP, 5eUTP, 6UTP, 6AF/UTP, 7S/FTP or 7aS/FTP TERA in a combination of single, dual, triple, or quad runs.
 - Install MAPIT G2 Intelligent Infrastructure Management System
 - Provide channel warrantee on all installations for a minimum of 20 years with the Siemon Corp. (coax installations do not apply)
 - Develop cabling systems for offices, ITS and data centers.
 - Install grounding systems for low voltage network applications.
 - Install multi-pair feeder telephone cable.
 - Install fiber optic cable (inside & outside plant) 50/125, 62.5/125 multimode and single mode.
 - Install and terminate coax cable in sizes RG6, Dual RG6, LMR195, LMR400, LMR600.
 - Install antenna as access points on towers not to exceed 50 feet in height.
 - Install cable tray, ladder rack, and relay rack.
 - Install conduit, conductors, and wiring devices.
 - Demolish conduit, conductors, and wiring devices.
- 1.2.3. The contractor must provide skilled, experienced data cabling craftsman directly employed and supervised by the contractor.
- 1.2.4. Any person providing data cabling service pursuant to the agreement, including the data cabling craftsman, shall be subject to the approval of MoDOT.

- 1.2.5. The contractor's workmanship shall meet or exceed the current BICSI/ANSI standards, International Data cabling and electrical Codes, NEC, NFPA, SMACNA standards, manufacturer's recommendations, and other current jurisdictional codes as required.
- 1.2.6. Since each data cabling service may differ in specific detail, the contractor shall familiarize themselves and perform work in a professional manner, so as to coincide with each building system.
- 1.2.7. Unless otherwise specified herein, the contractor shall provide all tools, equipment, building materials, and supplies necessary for performing the data cabling and specified herein. However, MoDOT reserves the right to furnish some building materials.
- 1.2.8. Prior to performing any data cabling services pursuant to the agreement, the contractor's employees must sign-in/sign-out daily with the MoDOT Information Systems project coordinator or their designated representative.
- 1.2.9. The MoDOT project coordinator or designee reserves the right to observe and witness any and/or all data cabling work performed pursuant to the agreement.
- 1.2.10. The contractor shall provide services during regular time as well as overtime.
- 1.2.11. Some projects may impose mandatory noise restriction during MoDOT's core business hours.
- 1.2.12. Hourly Work Requirements: If requested by MoDOT, the contractor shall provide one (1) or more persons to provide "data cabling services" on a temporary, hourly work basis.
- 1.2.13. The contractor must provide data cabling services within ten (10) working days after receiving notification from MoDOT of the need for such services.
- 1.2.14. In cases that are identified as an emergency by the Systems Network Management Supervisor or their representative, data cabling service response shall be within four (4) business days after receiving notification.
- 1.2.15. Contractor may not assign their obligation to another company.
- 1.2.16. MoDOT reserves the right to perform any of the work described in this agreement with its own employees.
- 1.2.17. This shall not restrict MoDOT to use this particular contractor in subsequent projects bid out to General Contractors. MoDOT reserves the right to bid out service projects, based on project size, cost effectiveness, time-constraints, etc. when necessary to obtain best value.

1.3. Data cabling Project Requirements (less than \$25,000)

1.3.1. If and when a data cabling project is identified, MoDOT may notify the contractor of the general description of data cabling the project. The contractor shall agree and understand that service projects may include but not necessarily be limited to, any of the services described in the general requirements and/or any of the following types of work.

- Install category 3UTP, 5eUTP, 6UTP, 6AF/UTP, 7S/FTP or 7aS/FTP TERA in a combination of single, dual, triple, or quad runs.
- Install MapIT G2 Intelligent Infrastructure Management System
- Provide channel warrantee on all installations for a minimum of 20 years with the Siemon Corp. (coax installations do not apply)
- Develop cabling systems for offices, ITS and data centers.
- Install grounding systems for low voltage network applications.
- Install multi-pair feeder telephone cable.
- Install fiber optic cable (inside & outside plant) 50/125, 62.5/125 multimode and single mode.
- Install and terminate coax cable in sizes RG6, Dual RG6, LMR195, LMR400, LMR600.
- Install antenna as access points on towers not to exceed 50 feet in height.
- Install cable tray, ladder rack, and relay rack.
- Install conduit, conductors, and wiring devices.
- Demolish conduit, conductors, and wiring devices.

1.3.2. By no later than one (1) calendar week after notification by MoDOT, the contractor must inspect the job site of the service project and must provide MoDOT with a written work plan which, at a minimum, contains the following information:

- The services and materials required to complete the service project.
- The number of hours required to complete the service project.
- A guaranteed not-to-exceed price for completing the service project utilizing the firm, fixed prices stated on the Pricing Page and the applicable classifications.
- A complete list of parts and/or materials (not including tools and equipment) needed to complete the service project.
- The contractor may be required to provide design documentation (blueprints) as a portion of the written work plan and "as built" drawings.
- MoDOT will supply recommended form.

1.3.3. MoDOT shall review the work plan and shall have the right to request modifications, changes, or additional elaboration to the written work plan in order to ensure successful completion of the service project according to MoDOT's needs. MoDOT reserves the right to accept or reject all or any portion of the contractor's written work plan. In addition, MoDOT reserves the right, after viewing the contractor's written work plan, to bid out the "service project" when necessary to obtain best value.

1.3.4. If the contractor's written work plan is accepted, MoDOT Information Systems project coordinator or their designated representative shall provide a written purchase order as a formal approval to proceed with each project.

1.3.5. The contractor shall not begin providing data cabling service until they receive a written purchase order from MoDOT.

1.3.6. A "NOTICE TO PROCEED" MUST BE ISSUED BY THE MODOT IN THE FORM OF A "VENDOR COPY" WRITTEN SIGNED PURCHASE ORDER FOR EACH APPROVED PROJECT.

1.3.7. By no later than the date specified in each work plan, after receiving written approval to proceed in the form of a purchase order from MoDOT, the contractor shall provide the mechanical services as approved in the written work plan.

- 1.3.8. The contractor may invoice the department for the development of a work plan pursuant to the requirements of this document where approval to is not provided within a reasonable time frame, typically sixty calendar days. Such price shall not exceed \$100.
- 1.3.9. The contractor shall agree and understand that MoDOT shall have the right to make changes in the requirements of a service project (size, configuration, etc.) prior to and during the contractor's work on the service project.
- 1.3.10. If MoDOT notifies the contractor of such changes, the contractor must submit a written change order to MoDOT if there are any changes to the approved written work plan as a result of MoDOT's changes in the requirements of the service project (e.g. types of data cabling services, number of hours of each type of data cabling service, the guaranteed not-to-exceed price, parts and/or materials, time frames for completion of the service project).
- 1.3.11. The contractor must again receive MoDOT's written approval signature on the change order before proceeding with the changes specified in the change order before deviations from the approved written work plan on that particular service project shall be allowed.
- 1.3.12. Upon completion of a service project, MoDOT Information Systems project coordinator shall inspect the service project and notify the contractor of the acceptability of the completed service project and verify the completion date. If the service project is not acceptable to MoDOT, the contractor shall take corrective action as determined necessary by MoDOT project coordinator.

1.4. Project Requirements (\$25,000 and greater)

- 1.4.1. At its sole discretion, the MHTC may use established pricing for large data cabling projects that have an estimated value of \$25,000 and greater.
- 1.4.2. If a data cabling project with an estimated value of \$25,000 and greater is approved, the requirements of this solicitation and other formal provision may apply which may include, but may not be limited to (1) a MHTC approved Performance Bond and (2) a formal MHTC Contract Agreement.
- 1.4.3. In no case shall MHTC be required to use this contracting method for any data cabling work.
- 1.4.4. The MHTC reserves the right to solicit formal or informal competition for any and all data cabling projects.

1.5. Requirements – Other

- 1.5.1. Agreements shall consist of: (1) this IFB and any amendments thereto, (2) the contractor's response (bid) to the IFB, (3) clarification of the bid, if any, and (4) MoDOT's acceptance of the bid by letter. All Exhibits and Attachments included in this IFB shall be incorporated into the final price agreement by reference.
- 1.5.2. The notice of award does not constitute a directive to proceed. Before providing equipment, supplies, and/or services, the contractor must receive authorization from the MoDOT Information Systems project coordinator or his/her designated representative prior to any services being performed.
- 1.5.3. The agreement expresses the complete agreement of the parties and performance shall be governed solely by the specifications and requirements contained therein.
- 1.5.4. Any change to the agreement, whether by modification and/or supplementation, must be accomplished by a formal change order signed and approved by and between the duly authorized representative of the contractor and MoDOT or by a field work-order prior to the effective date of such modification. The contractor expressly and explicitly understands and agrees that no other method and/or no other document, including correspondence from MoDOT, acts, and oral communications by or from any person, shall be used or construed as an amendment or modification to the agreement.
- 1.5.5. Price Agreement Period: The agreement shall remain in effect through August 2011. The agreement shall not bind, nor purport to bind, MHTC for any contractual commitment in excess of the original price agreement terms. If agreed upon by both parties, the price agreement may be extended for up to two, one-year periods. If extended, all terms and conditions, requirements, pricing, and specifications of the price agreement shall remain the same and apply during the renewal period.

Missouri Highways and Transportation Commission
Standard Bid/Proposal Provisions, General Terms and Conditions and Special Terms and Conditions

STANDARD SOLICITATION PROVISIONS

- a. The Missouri Department of Transportation (MoDOT) reserves the right to reject any or all bids/quotes/proposals, and to accept or reject any items thereon, and to waive technicalities. In case of error in the extension of prices in the bid/quote/proposal, unit prices will govern.
- b. All bids/quotes/proposals must be signed with the firm name and by a responsible officer or employee. Obligations assumed by such signature must be fulfilled.
- c. By virtue of statutory authority, a preference will be given to materials, products, supplies, provisions and all other articles produced, manufactured, made or grown, within the State of Missouri.
- d. No bids/proposals by telephone, telegram or telefax will be accepted.
- e. The date specified for the returning of bids/quotes/proposals is a firm deadline and all bids/quotes/proposals must be received at the designated office by that time. The Department does not recognize the U.S. Mail, Railway Express Agency, Air Express, or any other organization, as its agent for purposes of accepting proposals. All proposals arriving at the designated office after the deadline specified will be rejected.

GENERAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS

General Performance

- a. This work is to be performed under the general supervision and direction of the Missouri Department of Transportation (MoDOT) and, if awarded any portion of the work, the Contractor agrees to furnish at his own expense all labor and equipment required to complete the work, it being expressly understood that this solicitation is for completed work based upon the price(s) specified and is not a solicitation for rental of equipment or employment of labor by MoDOT, and MoDOT is to have no direction or control over the employees used by the Contractor in performance of the work.

Deliveries

- a. If the prices bid herein include the delivery cost of the material, the Contractor agrees to pay all transportation charges on the material as FOB - Destination. Freight costs must be included in the unit price bid and not listed as a separate line item.
- b. Any demurrage is to be paid by the Contractor direct to the railroad or carrier.

Nondiscrimination

- a. The Contractor shall comply with the Regulations relative to nondiscrimination in federally-assisted programs of the Department of Transportation, Title 49, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 21, as they may be amended from time to time, (hereinafter referred to as the Regulations), which are herein incorporated by reference and made a part of this contract.
- b. All solicitations either by competitive bidding or negotiation made by the Contractor for work to be performed under a subcontract, including procurements of materials or leases of the Contractor's obligations under this contract and the Regulations, will be relative to nondiscrimination on the grounds of race, color, or national origin.
 - 1) Sanctions for Noncompliance: In the event of the Contractor's noncompliance with the nondiscrimination provisions of this contract, MoDOT shall impose such contract sanctions as it or the Federal Highway Administration may determine to be appropriate, including, but not limited to:
 - i. withholding of payments to the Contractor under the contract until the Contractor complies, and/or,
 - ii. cancellation, termination or suspension of the contract, in whole or in part.

Contract/Purchase Order

- a. By submitting a bid/quote/proposal, the Bidder/Offeror agrees to furnish any and all equipment, supplies and/or services specified in the solicitation documents, at the prices quoted, pursuant to all requirements and specifications contained therein.
- b. A binding contract shall consist of: (1) the solicitation documents, amendments thereto, and/or Best and Final Offer (BAFO) request(s) with any changes/additions, (2) the Contractor's proposal and/or submitted pricing, and (3) the MHTC's acceptance of the proposal and/or bid by purchase order or post-award contract.
- c. A notice of award does not constitute an authorization for shipment of equipment or supplies or a directive to proceed with services. Before providing equipment, supplies and/or services, the Contractor must receive a properly authorized purchase order and/or notice to proceed.
- d. The contract expresses the complete agreement of the parties and performance shall be governed solely by the specifications and requirements contained therein. Any change, whether by modification and/or supplementation, must be accomplished by a formal contract amendment signed and approved by and between the duly authorized representative of the Contractor and the duly authorized representative of the MHTC, by a modified purchase order prior to the effective date of such modification. The Contractor expressly and explicitly understands and agrees that no other method and/or no other document, including correspondence, acts, and oral communications by or from any person, shall be used or construed as an amendment or modification.

Subcontracting

- a. It is specifically understood that no portion of the material or any interest in the contract, shall be subcontracted, transferred, assigned or otherwise disposed of, except with the written consent of MoDOT. Request for permission to subcontract or otherwise dispose of any part of the work shall be in writing to MoDOT and accompanied by documentation showing that the organization which will perform the work is particularly experienced and equipped for such work.
- b. Consent to subcontract or otherwise dispose of any portion of the work shall not be construed to relieve the Contractor of any responsibility for the production and delivery of the contracted work and the completion of the work within the specified time.
- c. All payments for work performed by a subcontractor shall be made to the Contractor to whom the contract was awarded and the purchase order issued.

Missouri Highways and Transportation Commission
Standard Bid/Proposal Provisions, General Terms and Conditions and Special Terms and Conditions

Invoicing and Payment

- a. MoDOT is exempt from paying Missouri Sales Tax, Missouri Use Tax and Federal Excise Tax. However, the Contractor may themselves be responsible for the payment of taxes on materials they purchase to fulfill the contract. A Project Tax Exemption Certificate will be furnished to the successful Bidder/Offeror upon request if applicable.
- b. Each invoice should be itemized in accordance with items listed on the purchase order and/or contract. The statewide financial management system has been designed to capture certain receipt and payment information. Therefore, each invoice submitted must reference the purchase order number and must be itemized in accordance with items listed on the purchase order. Failure to comply with this requirement may delay processing of invoices for payment.
- c. Unless otherwise provided for in the solicitation documents, payment for all equipment, supplies, and/or services required herein shall be made in arrears. The Missouri Highways and Transportation Commission (MHTC) shall not make any advance deposits.
- d. The MHTC assumes no obligation for equipment, supplies, and/or services shipped or provided in excess of the quantity ordered. Any authorized quantity is subject to the MHTC's rejection and shall be returned at the Contractor's expense.
- e. The MHTC reserves the right to purchase goods and services using the state-purchasing card.

Applicable Laws and Regulations

- a. The contract shall be construed according to the laws of the State of Missouri. The Contractor shall comply with all local, state, and federal laws and regulations related to the performance of the contract.
- b. The Contractor must be registered and maintain good standing with the Secretary of State of the State of Missouri and other regulatory agencies, as may be required by law or regulations. Prior to the issuance of a purchase order and/or notice to proceed, the Contractor may be required to submit to MoDOT a copy of their current Authority Certificate from the Secretary of State of the State of Missouri.
 - 1) Prior to the issuance of a purchase order and/or notice to proceed, all **out-of-state** Contractors **providing services** within the state of Missouri must submit to MoDOT a copy of their current Transient Employer Certificate from the Department of Revenue, in addition to a copy of their current Authority Certificate from the Secretary of State of the State of Missouri.
- c. The exclusive venue for any legal proceeding relating to or arising, out of the contract shall be in the Circuit Court of Cole County, Missouri.

Executive Order

- a. The Contractor shall comply with all the provisions of Executive Order 07-13, issued by the Honorable Matt Blunt, Governor of Missouri, on the sixth (6th) day of March, 2007. This Executive Order, which promulgates the State of Missouri's position to not tolerate persons who contract with the state engaging in or supporting illegal activities of employing individuals who are not eligible to work in the United States, is incorporated herein by reference and made a part of this Agreement.
 - 1) "By signing this Agreement, the Contractor hereby certifies that any employee of the Contractor assigned to perform services under the contract is eligible and authorized to work in the United States in compliance with federal law."
 - 2) In the event the Contractor fails to comply with the provisions of the Executive Order 07-13, or in the event the Commission has reasonable cause to believe that the contractor has knowingly employed individuals who are not eligible to work in the United States in violation of federal law, the Commission reserves the right to impose such contract sanctions as it may determine to be appropriate, including but not limited to contract cancellation, termination or suspension in whole or in part or both.
 - 3) The Contractor shall include the provisions of this paragraph in every subcontract. The Contractor shall take such action with respect to any subcontract as the Commission may direct as a means of enforcing such provisions, including sanctions for noncompliance.

Preferences

- a. In the evaluation of bids/quotes/proposals, preferences shall be applied in accordance with Chapter 34 RSMo. Contractors should apply the same preferences in selecting subcontractors.
- b. By virtue of statutory authority, RSMo. 34.076 and 34.350 to 34.359, a preference will be given to materials, products, supplies, provisions and all other articles produced, manufactured, made or grown within the State of Missouri. Such preference shall be given when quality is equal or better and delivered price is the same or less.
 - 1) If attached, the document entitled "**PREFERENCE IN PURCHASING PRODUCTS**" should be completed and returned with the solicitation documents.
 - 2) If attached, the document entitled "**MISSOURI DOMESTIC PRODUCTS PROCUREMENT ACT**" should be completed and returned with the solicitation documents. **Applies if bid is Twenty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000.00) or more.**
- c. By virtue of statutory authority, RSMo 34.074, a preference will be given all contracts for the performance of any job or service to service-disabled veteran business either doing business as Missouri firms, corporations, or individuals; or which maintain Missouri offices or places of business, when the quality of performance promised is equal or better and the price quoted is the same or less or whenever competing bids, in their entirety, are comparable.
 - 1) If attached, the document entitled "**MISSOURI SERVICE-DISABLED VETERAN PREFERENCE**" should be completed and returned with the solicitation documents.
- d. In the event of a tie of low bids, the MHTC reserves the right to establish the method to be used in determining the award

Remedies and Rights

- a. No provision in the contract shall be construed, expressly or implied, as a waiver by the MHTC of any existing or future right and/or remedy available by law in the event of any claim by the MHTC of the Contractor's default or breach of contract.

Missouri Highways and Transportation Commission
Standard Bid/Proposal Provisions, General Terms and Conditions and Special Terms and Conditions

- b. The Contractor agrees and understands that the contract shall constitute an assignment by the Contractor to the MHTC of all rights, title and interest in and to all causes of action that the Contractor may have under the antitrust laws of the United States or State of Missouri for which causes of action have accrued or will accrue as the result of or in relation to the particular equipment, supplies, and/or services purchased or produced by the Contractor in the fulfillment of the contract with the MHTC.
- c. In the event a Contractor becomes involved in, or is threatened with, litigation with a subcontractor or supplier as a result of such direction, the Contractor may request MoDOT to enter into such litigation to protect the interests of the MHTC, and, in addition, the Contractor may request the United States to enter into such litigation to protect the interests of the United States.

Cancellation of Contract

- a. The MHTC may cancel the contract at any time for a material breach of contractual obligations or for convenience by providing the Contractor with written notice of cancellation. Should the MHTC exercise its right to cancel the contract for such reasons, cancellation will become effective upon the date specified in the notice of cancellation sent to the Contractor.
- b. If the MHTC cancels the contract for breach, the MHTC reserves the right to obtain the equipment, supplies, and/or services to be provided pursuant to the contract from other sources and upon such terms and in such manner as the MHTC deems appropriate and charge the Contractor for any additional costs incurred thereby.

Bankruptcy or Insolvency

- a. Upon filing for any bankruptcy or insolvency proceeding by or against the Contractor, whether voluntary or involuntary, or upon the appointment of a receiver, trustee, or assigned the benefit or creditors, the Contractor must notify MoDOT immediately. Upon learning of any such actions, the MHTC reserves the right, at its sole discretion, to either cancel the contract or affirm the contract and hold the Contractor responsible for damages.

Inventions, Patents, and Copyrights

- a. The Contractor shall defend, protect, and hold harmless the MHTC, its officers, agents, and employees against all suits of law or in equity resulting from patent and copyright infringement concerning the Contractor's performance or products produced under the terms of the contract.

Inspection and Acceptance

- a. No equipment, supplies, and/or services received by MoDOT pursuant to a contract shall be deemed accepted until MoDOT has had reasonable opportunity to inspect said equipment, supplies, and/or services.
- b. All equipment, supplies, and/or services which do not comply with the specifications and/or requirements or which are otherwise unacceptable or defective may be rejected. In addition, all equipment, supplies, and/or services which are discovered to be defective or which do not conform to any warranty of the Contractor upon inspection (or at any later time if the defects contained were not reasonably ascertainable upon the initial inspection) may be rejected.
- c. The MHTC reserves the right to return any such rejected shipment at the Contractor's expense for full credit or replacement and to specify a reasonable date by which replacements must be received.
- d. The MHTC's right to reject any unacceptable equipment, supplies, and/or services shall not exclude any other legal, equitable or contractual remedies the MHTC may have.

Warranty

- a. The Contractor expressly warrants that all equipment, supplies, and/or services provided shall: (1) conform to each and every specification, drawing, sample or other description which was furnished to or adopted by MoDOT, (2) be fit and sufficient for the purpose expressed in the solicitation documents, (3) be merchantable, (4) be of good materials and workmanship, and (5) be free from defect.
- b. Such warranty shall survive delivery and shall not be deemed waived either by reason of the MHTC's acceptance of or payment for said equipment, supplies, and/or services.

Status of Independent Contractor

- a. The Contractor represents itself to be an independent Contractor offering such services to the general public and shall not represent itself or its employees to be an employee of the MHTC. Therefore, the Contractor shall assume all legal and financial responsibility for taxes, FICA, employee fringe benefits, workers' compensation, employee insurance, minimum wage requirements, overtime, etc., and agrees to indemnify, save and hold the MHTC, its officers, agents and employees harmless from and against any and all losses (including attorney fees) and damage of any kind related to such matters.

Indemnification

- a. The Offeror shall defend, indemnify and hold harmless the Commission, including its members and department employees, from any claim or liability whether based on a claim for damages to real or personal property or to a person for any matter relating to or arising out of the Offeror's performance of its obligations under this Agreement.

SPECIAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS

Insurance

The Contractor shall maintain or cause to be maintained at Contractor's own expense commercial general liability, automobile liability, worker's compensation insurance against negligent acts, errors or omissions of the Contractor, or its subcontractors and anyone directly or indirectly employed by any of them. Any insurance policy required as specified in this Section shall be written by a company that is licensed and authorized to issue such insurance in the state of Missouri and shall provide insurance coverage for not less than the following limits of liability:

- a. General Liability: Not less than \$500,000 for any one person in a single accident or occurrence, and not less than \$3,000,000 for all claims arising out of a single occurrence;
- b. Automobile Liability: Not less than \$500,000 for any one person in a single accident or occurrence, and not less than \$3,000,000 for all claims arising out of a single occurrence;
- c. Missouri State Workmen's Compensation policy or equivalent in accordance with state law.

Upon request from the Commission, the Contractor shall provide the Commission with certificates of insurance evidencing the required coverage and that such insurance is in effect.

Information and Reports

- a. The Contractor shall provide all information and reports required by the Regulations, or Directives issued pursuant thereto, and shall permit access to its books, records, accounts, other sources of information, and its facilities as may be determined by the Missouri Department of Transportation or the Federal Highway Administration to be pertinent to ascertain compliance with such Regulations or Directives. Where any information required of a Contractor is in the exclusive possession of another who fails or refuses to furnish this information the Contractor shall so certify to the Missouri Department of Transportation, or the Federal Highway Administration as appropriate, and shall set forth what efforts it has made to obtain the information.

Prevailing Wage

- a. If the bid/quote/proposal is accepted, the vendor will be required to comply with the prevailing wages as fixed by the Missouri Department of Labor and Industrial Relations, in effect as of the date of the issuance of the solicitation, for each affected craft and type of workmen in all Missouri counties and St. Louis City. The Annual Wage Order #17 may be inspected at any District Office or at the Central Office in Jefferson City, MO.
- b. The Contractor shall submit notarized weekly payroll affidavit documentation included with the project request for payment. The successful vendor must provide a lien waiver from all material suppliers.

Permits, Licenses and Safety Issues

- a. The contract price shall include any necessary permits and licenses required by law incidental to the work. Local ordinances requiring building permits are not applicable to state agencies.
- b. The Contractor will comply with local laws involving safety in the prosecution of the work.

AWARD - AWARD OF THIS BID/QUOTE/PROPOSAL WILL BE MADE ON AN "ITEM BY ITEM" BASIS USING THE "LOWEST AND BEST" PRINCIPLE OF AWARD.

Failure to Execute Contract

- a. Failure to execute the contract and file acceptable performance payment (Contract Bond) or cashier's check, bank money order or certified check within **15 days** after the contract has been mailed to the bidder shall be just cause for the cancellation of the award and the forfeiture of the proposal guaranty. Award may then be made to the next lowest responsible bidder, or the work may be re-advertised and performed under contract or otherwise, as the Commission may decide. No contract shall be considered effective until it has been executed by all parties thereto.

Notice to Proceed

- a. **A "NOTICE TO PROCEED" WILL BE ISSUED BY THE DEPARTMENT IN THE FORM OF A "VENDOR COPY" WRITTEN SIGNED PURCHASE ORDER.**

Temporary Suspension of Work

- a. The **District Engineer** shall have authority to suspend work wholly or in part for such period or periods as may be deemed necessary when weather or other conditions are such that in the opinion of the engineer, the work may be done at a later time with advantage to the Department or for failure on the part of the Contractor to comply with any of the provisions of the Contract.
- b. If the Department suspends the work for its own advantages and not because of the Contractor's failure to comply with the Contract, the Contractor will be allowed an equal number of calendar days after the completion date for the completion of the work. The Department may at its discretion give the Contractor an extension of time for completing the work where the Contractor incurs delays for causes beyond his control.
- c. Normal rainfall is not considered a cause qualifying for an extension of time. Claim for extension of time for all causes must be submitted by the Contractor in writing within **30 Days** after the claimed cause for the delay has ceased to exist.

Standard Bid/Proposal Provisions, General Terms and Conditions and Special Terms and Conditions

Cancellation of Contract

- a. If the Contractor/supplier fails to carry out the performance of the work with sufficient workmen and equipment to insure the completion of the delivery within the time specified or becomes insolvent or is adjudicated a bankrupt or commits any act of bankruptcy or insolvency or allows any final judgment to stand against him for a period of ten (10) days, the Missouri Department of Transportation may give notice in writing by registered mail to the Contractor/supplier and the surety of such delay, neglect or default.
- b. If, within ten (10) days after such notice the Contractor/supplier does not proceed to remedy to the satisfaction of the Department's representatives the faults specified in said notice, or the surety does not proceed to take over the deliveries, the Department shall have full power and authority, without impairing the obligation of the Contractor/supplier under the contract or the surety under the bond, to take over the completion of the work and arrange for the shipment of any materials necessary to complete the work and the Contractor/supplier and the surety will be responsible for any additional costs incurred by the Department in obtaining the completion of the deliveries.

Liquidated Damages

- a. In the event the successful Contractor fails to deliver the material within the time specified, the Department and the public will sustain damages because of such delay in delivery, the exact extent of which would be difficult to ascertain, and in order to liquidate such damage in advance it is agreed that the **sum of one-hundred dollars (\$100.00) per day, per item**, for each assessable calendar day on which the delivery has not been completed, is reasonable and the best estimate which the parties can arrive at as liquidated damages, and it is therefore agreed that said amount will be withheld from payments due the Contractor or otherwise collected from the Contractor as liquidated damages.
- b. **Saturdays, Sundays, holidays and days whereas the Department has suspended work** shall not be assessable days.

Environmental Issues

Attention of the bidder is invited to the **Land Reclamation Act, Chapter 444, Laws of 1971, (House Bill 519)** and the necessity for compliance if applicable.

The Contractor shall take necessary precautions and shall schedule and conduct his operations so as to avoid or minimize siltation of streams while removing gravel there from.

Prohibition Of Employment Of Unauthorized Aliens:

- a. Pursuant to RSMo 285.530 (1), no business entity or employer shall knowingly employ, hire for employment, or continue to employ an unauthorized alien to perform work within the state of Missouri. As a condition for the award of any contract or grant in excess of five thousand dollars by the state or by any political subdivision of the state to a business entity, or for any business entity receiving a state-administered or subsidized tax credit, tax abatement, or loan from the state, the business entity shall, by sworn affidavit and provision of documentation, affirm its enrollment and participation in a federal work authorization program with respect to the employees working in connection with the contracted services. Every such business entity shall sign an affidavit affirming that it does not knowingly employ any person who is unauthorized alien in connection with the contracted services. [RSMO 285.530 (2)] A copy of the affidavit referenced above is provided within this document.

E-Verify is an example of a federal work authorization program. Acceptable enrollment and participation documentation consists of **completed** copy of the E-Verify Memorandum of Understanding (MOU). For vendors that are not already enrolled and participating in a federal work authorization program, E-Verify is available at http://www.dhs.gov/xprevprot/programs/gc_1185221678150.shtm.

Construction Safety Program

- a. Missouri law, 292.675 RSMo, requires the awarded Contractor and its subcontractor(s) to provide a ten-hour occupational safety and health administration (OSHA) construction safety program (or a similar program approved by the Missouri Department of Labor and Industrial Relations as a qualified substitute) for their on-site employees (laborers, workmen, drivers, equipment operators, and craftsmen) who have not previously completed such a program and are directly engaged in actual construction of the improvement (or working at a nearby or adjacent facility used for construction of the improvement). The Contractor and its subcontractor(s) shall require all such employees to complete this ten-hour program, pursuant to 292.675 RSMo, unless they hold documentation on their prior completion of said program. Penalties for non-compliance include Contractor forfeiture to the Commission in the amount of \$2,500, plus \$100 per contractor and subcontractor employee for each calendar day such employee is employed beyond the elapsed time period for required program completion under 292.675 RSMo.
