

Dearborn Rest Area Sewer Improvements

VENDOR QUESTIONS:

- 1) What are the requirements relating to the brush clearance? Can the contractor pile it? Can they burn it? Do they have to haul it off?
Answer: Piling – NO. Mulching is an acceptable method - product could be spread on site or check with local maintenance crew to see if they have a need. Clearing and grubbing shall be disposed of in accordance with any local or state regulations. If burning is permitted in the area, that would be an allowable method of disposal. If hauling the grubbing off, it shall be disposed of properly.
- 2) Page 12 of the Dearborn Plans shows a 6' concrete culvert in the upper left corner. The plans do not show a bore. There was water running through the culvert. Should this be a bore?
Answer: A bore is not required. The contractor needs to determine the most cost effective method to cross the culvert pipe.
- 3) How can the contractor access this project? Answer: Interstate/highway, with proper traffic control. Is the interstate the only access they have or can they cross private property to get to it?
Answer: Gaining access by crossing private property is the contractor's responsibility.
- 4) Does MoDOT provide the signage for this project or the contractor?
Answer: Contractor shall provide proper signage.



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
