## 1. INTRODUCTION AND GENERAL INFORMATION

### 1.1 Introduction:

- 1.1.1 This Request for Bid seeks bids from qualified organizations to provide herbicides, with an effective contract period of Notice to Proceed through December 31, 2011, to the Missouri Highways and Transportation Commission (MHTC) and Missouri Department of Transportation (MoDOT). Each bid must be mailed in a sealed envelope to Ms. Brenda Tyree, General Services Procurement Unit, 830 MoDOT Drive, P.O. Box 270, Jefferson City, Mo 65109, or hand-delivered in a sealed envelope to the General Services Procurement Office in the Highway and Transportation Building at 830 MoDOT Drive, Jefferson City, Missouri. All questions regarding the RFB shall be submitted to Ms. Brenda Tyree. Bids must be returned to the office of Ms. Brenda Tyree no later than 10:00 a.m., CST, December 28, 2010.

**1.2 General Information:**

1.2.1 This document constitutes an invitation for competitive, sealed bids for the procurement of herbicides as set forth herein.

1.2.2 Organization - This document, referred to as a Request for Bid (RFB), is divided into the following parts:

- 1) Introduction and General Information
- 2) Scope of Work
- 3) Bid Submission
- 4) Pricing Pages
- 5) Attachment A
- 6) Terms and Conditions

## 2. SCOPE OF WORK

### 2.1 General Requirements:

- 2.1.1 The contractor shall provide herbicides on an as needed, if needed basis for the Missouri Highway and Transportation Commission (MHTC) and Missouri Department of Transportation (MoDOT), in accordance with the provisions and requirements stated herein.
- 2.1.2 The contractor shall provide all deliverables/services to the sole satisfaction of the MoDOT.
- 2.1.3 MoDOT estimates, but does not guarantee, the purchase of the estimated quantities stated herein.
- 2.1.4 The MoDOT reserves the right to obtain "like or similar" products as specified herein from other manufacturers, exclusive of the contract, when use of such products is deemed in the best interest of the MoDOT.
- 2.1.5 The contractor shall agree and understand that MoDOT representatives have the option of selecting between like options (name brand vs. line item substitution) at their discretion.
- 2.1.6 When placing an herbicide order, MoDOT will make every effort to order quantities not to cause an undue burden of shipping costs to be incurred by the contractor. In an effort to maintain low on-site inventories, MoDOT will place orders according to the seasonal application of each herbicide.
- 2.1.7 The contractor shall agree and understand that any herbicides delivered to MoDOT that is labeled differently than the labels submitted with the contractor's bid may be rejected.
  - a. All herbicides must be registered in Missouri and manufactured in the United States.
  - b. All herbicides furnished as a result of this document shall be inspected and approved before use. Inspection of the herbicides may be made at the point of manufacture, intermediate storage point, or at destination at the discretion of MoDOT. Material damaged in transit will be subject to rejection at its destination.
- 2.1.8 The contractor shall provide herbicides in the size of containers as specified herein.
  - a. Bulk packaging shall not be accepted, except as specified herein.
- 2.1.9 Unless otherwise specified herein, the contractor shall furnish all material, labor, facilities, equipment, and supplies necessary to provide the deliverables/services required herein.

### 2.2 Returnable/Refillable Container System Requirements:

- 2.2.1 For the products identified on the pricing pages herein, the contractor shall provide a Returnable/Refillable Container System that, at a minimum, meets the following requirements:
  - a. System shall be a Returnable / Refillable Container Management and Tracking System or approved equivalent.
  - b. Liquid containers shall be fifteen (15) gallon returnable/refillable drums made of plastic and natural in color to allow clear viewing of contents.
  - c. Liquid containers shall have one (1) gallon and one (1) liter measuring increments clearly visible down the side of the drums.

- d. Liquid containers shall have a convex center sump and top and bottom handling rings.
  - e. Liquid containers shall have one (1) opening which holds a stainless steel micromatic valve with viton seals. No other drum openings are allowed.
  - f. Liquid containers shall be bar coded for internet tracking and reporting.
  - g. Dry pellet containers shall be four (4) pound returnable/refillable packages made of plastic and natural in color to allow clear viewing of contents.
  - h. All fifteen (15) gallon returnable/refillable containers shall be delivered on a plastic returnable pallet with a plastic lid secured with straps. Containers shall be packaged and delivered with nine (9) containers to a pallet. Chemicals can be mixed and matched within the nine (9) container pallet.
  - i. All containers and contents shall be accounted for with the following reports and capabilities available via a secure website:
    - 1) Container and product movements by shipping locations report
    - 2) Shipment detail by shipping locations report
    - 3) Viewing of current and past shipments by location reports. Must have time line search capability. Tracking of shipments through entire shipping and receiving process along with order status availability.
    - 4) Drum look up capability to allow user to enter drum ID number and access information on drum and contents.
  - j. Internet reports shall be available at all times and be accessible through a secure website accessible by a username and password.
  - k. System must have the capability to provide system wide inventory reporting for all shipping locations via the internet for all products delivered in returnable containers.
- 2.2.2. If requested by MoDOT, the contractor shall provide transfer pumps as specified herein to all MoDOT Districts located throughout the State of Missouri (See Attachment A).
- 2.2.3 If requested by MoDOT, the contractor shall provide transfer cubes as specified herein to all MoDOT Districts located throughout the State of Missouri.
- 2.3 Delivery Requirements:**
- 2.3.1 The contractor shall deliver herbicides as specified herein to all MoDOT Districts located throughout the State of Missouri . The contractor shall deliver such herbicides F.O.B. destination.
- 2.3.2 The contractor shall not deliver any herbicides to MoDOT until being notified by MoDOT by telephone or purchase order.
- a. If a telephone order is made, it is the contractor's responsibility to insure a purchase order is forthcoming from MoDOT.

- 2.3.3 The contractor shall deliver herbicides within ten (10) working days from the date order is placed, excluding Saturday, Sunday, Holidays, and days whereas MoDOT has suspended work.
- 2.3.4 The contractor shall notify MoDOT twenty-four (24) hours prior to delivery.
- 2.3.5 With the delivery of each herbicide to the various MoDOT locations, the contractor shall furnish Manufacturer's labels and Material Data Safety Sheets for each product.

**2.4 Liquidated Damage Requirements:**

- 2.4.1 The contractor shall agree and understand that providing the herbicides in accordance with the requirements stated herein is considered critical to the efficient operations of the MoDOT. However, since the amount of actual damages would be difficult to establish in the event the contractor fails to comply with the contractual requirements, the contractor shall agree and understand that the amount identified below as liquidated damages shall be reasonable and fair under the circumstances.
  - a. In the event the contractor fails to provide herbicides in accordance with the contractual requirements specified herein, the contractor shall be assessed liquidated damages in the amount of \$100.00 per day per order for each such delinquent day.
  - b. The contractor shall further agree and understand that such liquidated damages shall either be deducted from the total amount due the contractor or paid by the contractor as a direct payment to the MoDOT, at the sole discretion of the MoDOT.
  - c. The contractor shall understand that the liquidated damages described herein shall not be construed as a penalty.
  - d. The contractor shall understand and agree that all assessments of liquidated damages shall be within the discretion of each District as a separate entity, and shall be in addition to, not in lieu of, the rights of the State of Missouri to pursue other appropriate remedies. The contractor shall understand and agree that each District's decision shall be individual, final, and without recourse.
  - e. The contractor shall agree and understand that all assessments of liquidated damages shall be within the discretion of the State of Missouri and shall be in addition to, not in lieu of, the rights of the State of Missouri to pursue other appropriate remedies.

**2.5 Invoicing and Payment Requirements:**

- 2.5.1 The contractor shall submit an itemized invoice to the applicable requesting address for the completion of deliverables, as specified herein.
- 2.5.2 The contractor shall be paid in accordance with the firm, fixed prices stated on the pricing pages of this document, after completion of deliverables specified herein and acceptance by the MoDOT.
- 2.5.3 Other than the payment specified above, no other payments or reimbursements shall be made to the contractor for any reason whatsoever.
- 2.5.4 MoDOT is exempt from paying Missouri Sales Tax, Missouri Use Tax and Federal Excise Tax. However, the contractor may themselves be responsible for the payment of taxes on materials they purchase to fulfill the contract. A Federal Excise Tax Exemption Certificate will be furnished to the successful bidder upon request.

- 2.5.5 Unless otherwise provided for in the solicitation documents, payment for all equipment, supplies, and/or services required herein shall be made in arrears. The Missouri Highways and Transportation Commission (MHTC) shall not make any advance deposits.
- 2.5.6 The MHTC assumes no obligation for equipment, supplies, and/or services shipped or provided in excess of the quantity ordered. Any authorized quantity is subject to the MHTC's rejection and shall be returned at the contractor's expense.
- 2.5.7 The MHTC reserves the right to purchase goods and services using the state-purchasing card.
- 2.6.1 Other Contractual Requirements:**
  - 2.6.1 Contract Period - The contract shall commence from the Notice to Proceed until December 31, 2011.
  - 2.6.2 Inspection Specifications - MoDOT reserves the right to inspect the material at the point of manufacture, intermediate storage point, or at a destination which shall be at the discretion of MoDOT.

### 3. BID SUBMISSION

#### 3.1 Bid Submission Information:

3.1.1 All bids must be received in a sealed envelope clearly marked "Herbicides".

3.1.2 All bids must be received at the following address no later than December 28, 2010 at 10:00 a.m., CST.

3.1.3 The bidder may withdraw, modify or correct his bid after it has been deposited with the Department provided such request is submitted in writing and received at the location designated for the bid opening prior to the time specified for opening bids. Such a request received as specified will be attached to the bid and the bid will be considered to have been modified accordingly. No bid may be modified after the time specified for the opening of bids.

3.1.4 Bids will be reviewed to determine if the bid complies with the mandatory requirements, and to determine the lowest and best bid.

3.1.5 The bidder must submit with each bid a current complete Manufacturer's Label and Materials Safety Data Sheet, including the chemical composition for each product to be furnished and directions for application, precautionary statements, environmental hazards, pesticide and container disposal and any other pertinent information such as the required minimum standards listed for surfactants. Any material delivered that is labeled differently than the labels accompanying the bids may be rejected. All herbicides must be registered in Missouri and labeled in accordance with State Law. Herbicides must be labeled to permit their use on highway right of way.

3.1.6 The bidder must submit with the bid a "Certificate of Analysis" for Non-ionic Surfactant as specified herein.

3.1.7 MoDOT reserves the right to order name brand items or substitute items, not necessarily name brand items and substitute items (EXAMPLE: line item 1 or line item 1A, and line item 8 or line item 8A).

3.1.8 *Cost Determination* - The low bid shall be determined for each line item (excluding line items 12 and 13) by adding the estimated quantities, and multiplying the total of the estimated quantities with the unit price. The low bid shall be determined for line items 12 and 13 by using the following formula, and multiplying the cost per 100 gallons price with the total of the estimated quantities for each line item.

a. Exception for Line item 12 and 13 - The cost analysis shall be based on a "per 100 gallon rate" applied at 33.33 gallons carrier rate.

- Configuration = 100 gallons treats 3 acres
- Lowest label rate for ROW herbicides shall be used for cost determination.

1) (EXAMPLE: *Label states 48 ounces per 100 gallons* - (bidder's price per gallon divided by 128 (number of ounces per gallon) = \_\_\_\_\_ multiplied by 48 = \$ \_\_\_\_\_ (cost per 100 gallons).

2) (EXAMPLE: *Label states 32 ounces per 100 gallons* - (bidder's price per gallon divided by 128 (number of ounces per gallon) = \_\_\_\_\_ multiplied by 32 = \$ \_\_\_\_\_ (cost per 100 gallons).

- 3) (EXAMPLE: Label states 32 ounces per 50 gallons - (bidder's price per gallon divided by 128 (number of ounces per gallon) = \_\_\_\_\_ multiplied by 64 (Number of ounces for 50 gallons x 2) = \$\_\_\_\_\_ (cost per 100 gallons).
- 4) (EXAMPLE: Label states 12 ounces per acre (formula = 36(12 x 3) ounces per 100 gallons) - (bidder's price per gallon divided by 128 (number of ounces per gallon) = \_\_\_\_\_ multiplied by 36 = \$\_\_\_\_\_ (cost per 100 gallons).

3.1.9 *Contract Award* – The contract will be awarded to the lowest responsive bidder determined as specified above.

- a. Award of this bid will be made on an “Item-By-Item” basis using the “lowest and best” principle of award.
- b. MoDOT reserves the right to make multiple awards.
- c. In addition to the listed herbicides, several products identical in active ingredients and listed by chemical name will be awarded with the understanding the end user has the option of purchasing the name brand or chemical named product. These will be clearly designated on the bid sheet. No substitutions will be allowed for the name brands listed. Product names will be required for items where a brand name is not listed. In the event of tie low bids, MoDOT reserves the right to establish the method to be used in determining the award.
- d. MoDOT reserves the right to reject any or all bids, and no award is final until formally approved.

3.1.10 *Open Competition / Request for Bid Document:*

- a. It shall be the bidder's responsibility to ask questions, request changes or clarification, or otherwise advise the MoDOT if any language, specifications or requirements of an RFB appear to be ambiguous, contradictory, and/or arbitrary, or appear to inadvertently restrict or limit the requirements stated in the RFB to a single source. Any and all communication from bidders regarding specifications, requirements, competitive bid process, etc., must be directed to the buyer from the MoDOT, unless the RFB specifically refers the bidder to another contact. Such communication should be received at least three (3) working days prior to the official bid opening date.
- b. Every attempt shall be made to ensure that the bidder receives an adequate and prompt response. However, in order to maintain a fair and equitable bid process, all bidders will be advised, via the issuance of an amendment to the RFB, of any relevant or pertinent information related to the procurement. Therefore, bidders are advised that unless specified elsewhere in the RFB, any questions received less than three (3) working days prior to the RFB opening date may not be answered.
- c. Bidders are cautioned that the only official position of the State of Missouri is that which is issued by the MoDOT in the RFB or an amendment thereto. No other means of communication, whether oral or written, shall be construed as a formal or official response or statement.
- d. The MoDOT monitors all procurement activities to detect any possibility of deliberate restraint of competition, collusion among bidders, price-fixing by bidders, or any other anticompetitive conduct by bidders which appears to violate state and federal antitrust laws. Any suspected violation shall be referred to the Missouri Attorney General's Office for appropriate action.

- g. The date specified for the returning of bids/quotes/proposals is a firm deadline and all bids/quotes/proposals must be received at the designated office by that time. The Department does not recognize the U.S. Mail, Railway Express Agency, Air Express, or any other organization, as its agent for purposes of accepting proposals. All proposals arriving at the designated office after the deadline specified will be rejected.

**GENERAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS**

**General Performance**

- a. This work is to be performed under the general supervision and direction of the Missouri Department of Transportation (MoDOT) and, if awarded any portion of the work, the Contractor agrees to furnish at his own expense all labor and equipment required to complete the work, it being expressly understood that this solicitation is for completed work based upon the price(s) specified and is not a solicitation for rental of equipment or employment of labor by MoDOT, and MoDOT is to have no direction or control over the employees used by the Contractor in performance of the work.

**Deliveries**

- a. Unless otherwise specified on the solicitation documents or purchase order, suppliers shall give at least 24 hours advance notice of each delivery. Delivery will only be received between the hours of 8:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m., Monday through Friday. Material arriving after 3:00 p.m. will not be unloaded until the following workday. No material will be received on Saturday, Sunday or state holidays.
- b. If the prices bid herein include the delivery cost of the material, the Contractor agrees to pay all transportation charges on the material as FOB - Destination. Freight costs must be included in the unit price bid and not listed as a separate line item.
- c. Any demurrage is to be paid by the Contractor direct to the railroad or carrier.

**Nondiscrimination**

- a. The Contractor shall comply with the Regulations relative to nondiscrimination in federally-assisted programs of the Department of Transportation, Title 49, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 21, as they may be amended from time to time, (hereinafter referred to as the Regulations), which are herein incorporated by reference and made a part of this contract.
- b. All solicitations either by competitive bidding or negotiation made by the Contractor for work to be performed under a subcontract, including procurements of materials or leases of the Contractor's obligations under this contract and the Regulations, will be relative to nondiscrimination on the grounds of race, color, or national origin.
  - 1) **Sanctions for Noncompliance:** In the event of the Contractor's noncompliance with the nondiscrimination provisions of this contract, MoDOT shall impose such contract sanctions as it or the Federal Highway Administration may determine to be appropriate, including, but not limited to:
    - i. withholding of payments to the Contractor under the contract until the Contractor complies, and/or,
    - ii. cancellation, termination or suspension of the contract, in whole or in part.

**Contract/Purchase Order**

- a. By submitting a bid/quote/proposal, the Bidder/Offeror agrees to furnish any and all equipment, supplies and/or services specified in the solicitation documents, at the prices quoted, pursuant to all requirements and specifications contained therein.
- b. A binding contract shall consist of: (1) the solicitation documents, amendments thereto, and/or Best and Final Offer (BAFO) request(s) with any changes/additions, (2) the Contractor's proposal and/or submitted pricing, and (3) the MHTC's acceptance of the proposal and/or bid by purchase order or post-award contract.
- c. A notice of award does not constitute an authorization for shipment of equipment or supplies or a directive to proceed with services. Before providing equipment, supplies and/or services, the Contractor must receive a properly authorized purchase order and/or notice to proceed.
- d. The contract expresses the complete agreement of the parties and performance shall be governed solely by the specifications and requirements contained therein. Any change, whether by modification and/or supplementation, must be accomplished by a formal contract amendment signed and approved by and between the duly authorized representative of the Contractor and the duly authorized representative of the MHTC, by a modified purchase order prior to the effective date of such modification. The Contractor expressly and explicitly understands and agrees that no other method and/or no other document, including correspondence, acts, and oral communications by or from any person, shall be used or construed as an amendment or modification.

**Subcontracting**

- a. It is specifically understood that no portion of the material or any interest in the contract, shall be subcontracted, transferred, assigned or otherwise disposed of, except with the written consent of MoDOT. Request for permission to subcontract or otherwise dispose of any part of the work shall be in writing to MoDOT and accompanied by documentation showing that the organization which will perform the work is particularly experienced and

equipped for such work.

- b. Consent to subcontract or otherwise dispose of any portion of the work shall not be construed to relieve the Contractor of any responsibility for the production and delivery of the contracted work and the completion of the work within the specified time.
- c. All payments for work performed by a subcontractor shall be made to the Contractor to whom the contract was awarded and the purchase order issued.

**Invoicing and Payment**

- a. MoDOT is exempt from paying Missouri Sales Tax, Missouri Use Tax and Federal Excise Tax. However, the Contractor may themselves be responsible for the payment of taxes on materials they purchase to fulfill the contract. A Project Tax Exemption Certificate will be furnished to the successful Bidder/Offeror upon request if applicable.
- b. Each invoice should be itemized in accordance with items listed on the purchase order and/or contract. The statewide financial management system has been designed to capture certain receipt and payment information. Therefore, each invoice submitted must reference the purchase order number and must be itemized in accordance with items listed on the purchase order. Failure to comply with this requirement may delay processing of invoices for payment.
- c. Unless otherwise provided for in the solicitation documents, payment for all equipment, supplies, and/or services required herein shall be made in arrears. The Missouri Highways and Transportation Commission (MHTC) shall not make any advance deposits.
- d. The MHTC assumes no obligation for equipment, supplies, and/or services shipped or provided in excess of the quantity ordered. Any authorized quantity is subject to the MHTC's rejection and shall be returned at the Contractor's expense.
- e. The MHTC reserves the right to purchase goods and services using the state-purchasing card.

**Applicable Laws and Regulations**

- a. The contract shall be construed according to the laws of the State of Missouri. The Contractor shall comply with all local, state, and federal laws and regulations related to the performance of the contract.
- b. The Contractor must be registered and maintain good standing with the Secretary of State of the State of Missouri and other regulatory agencies, as may be required by law or regulations. Prior to the issuance of a purchase order and/or notice to proceed, the Contractor may be required to submit to MoDOT a copy of their current Authority Certificate from the Secretary of State of the State of Missouri.
  - 1) Prior to the issuance of a purchase order and/or notice to proceed, all out-of-state Contractors providing services within the state of Missouri must submit to MoDOT a copy of their current Transient Employer Certificate from the Department of Revenue, in addition to a copy of their current Authority Certificate from the Secretary of State of the State of Missouri.
- c. The exclusive venue for any legal proceeding relating to or arising, out of the contract shall be in the Circuit Court of Cole County, Missouri.

**Executive Order**

- a. The Contractor shall comply with all the provisions of Executive Order 07-13, issued by the Honorable Matt Blunt, Governor of Missouri, on the sixth (6<sup>th</sup>) day of March, 2007. This Executive Order, which promulgates the State of Missouri's position to not tolerate persons who contract with the state engaging in or supporting illegal activities of employing individuals who are not eligible to work in the United States, is incorporated herein by reference and made a part of this Agreement.
  - 1) "By signing this Agreement, the Contractor hereby certifies that any employee of the Contractor assigned to perform services under the contract is eligible and authorized to work in the United States in compliance with federal law."
  - 2) In the event the Contractor fails to comply with the provisions of the Executive Order 07-13, or in the event the Commission has reasonable cause to believe that the contractor has knowingly employed individuals who are not eligible to work in the United States in violation of federal law, the Commission reserves the right to impose such contract sanctions as it may determine to be appropriate, including but not limited to contract cancellation, termination or suspension in whole or in part or both.
  - 3) The Contractor shall include the provisions of this paragraph in every subcontract. The Contractor shall take such action with respect to any subcontract as the Commission may direct as a means of enforcing such provisions, including sanctions for noncompliance.

**Preferences**

- a. In the evaluation of bids/quotes/proposals, preferences shall be applied in accordance with Chapter 34 RSMo. Contractors should apply the same preferences in selecting subcontractors.
- b. By virtue of statutory authority, RSMo. 34.076 and 34.350 to 34.359, a preference will be given to materials, products, supplies, provisions and all other articles produced, manufactured, made or grown within the State of Missouri. Such preference shall be given when quality is equal or better and delivered price is the same or less.
  - 1) If attached, the document entitled "**PREFERENCE IN PURCHASING PRODUCTS**" should be completed and returned with the solicitation documents.
  - 2) If attached, the document entitled "**MISSOURI DOMESTIC PRODUCTS PROCUREMENT ACT**" should be completed and returned with the solicitation documents. Applies if bid is Twenty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000.00) or more.
- c. By virtue of statutory authority, RSMo 34.074, a preference will be given all contracts for the performance of any job or service to service-disabled veteran business either doing business as Missouri firms, corporations, or individuals; or which maintain Missouri offices or places of business, when

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the quality of performance promised is equal or better and the price quoted is the same or less or whenever competing bids, in their entirety, are comparable.

1) If attached, the document entitled "MISSOURI SERVICE-DISABLED VETERAN PREFERENCE" should be completed and returned with the solicitation documents.

d. In the event of a tie of low bids, the MHTC reserves the right to establish the method to be used in determining the award

**Remedies and Rights**

- a. No provision in the contract shall be construed, expressly or implied, as a waiver by the MHTC of any existing or future right and/or remedy available by law in the event of any claim by the MHTC of the Contractor's default or breach of contract.
- b. The Contractor agrees and understands that the contract shall constitute an assignment by the Contractor to the MHTC of all rights, title and interest in and to all causes of action that the Contractor may have under the antitrust laws of the United States or State of Missouri for which causes of action have accrued or will accrue as the result of or in relation to the particular equipment, supplies, and/or services purchased or produced by the Contractor in the fulfillment of the contract with the MHTC.
- c. In the event a Contractor becomes involved in, or is threatened with, litigation with a subcontractor or supplier as a result of such direction, the Contractor may request MoDOT to enter into such litigation to protect the interests of the MHTC, and, in addition, the Contractor may request the United States to enter into such litigation to protect the interests of the United States.

**Cancellation of Contract**

- a. The MHTC may cancel the contract at any time for a material breach of contractual obligations or for convenience by providing the Contractor with written notice of cancellation. Should the MHTC exercise its right to cancel the contract for such reasons, cancellation will become effective upon the date specified in the notice of cancellation sent to the Contractor.
- b. If the MHTC cancels the contract for breach, the MHTC reserves the right to obtain the equipment, supplies, and/or services to be provided pursuant to the contract from other sources and upon such terms and in such manner as the MHTC deems appropriate and charge the Contractor for any additional costs incurred thereby.

**Bankruptcy or Insolvency**

- a. Upon filing for any bankruptcy or insolvency proceeding by or against the Contractor, whether voluntary or involuntary, or upon the appointment of a receiver, trustee, or assigned the benefit or creditors, the Contractor must notify MoDOT immediately. Upon learning of any such actions, the MHTC reserves the right, at its sole discretion, to either cancel the contract or affirm the contract and hold the Contractor responsible for damages.

**Inventions, Patents, and Copyrights**

- a. The Contractor shall defend, protect, and hold harmless the MHTC, its officers, agents, and employees against all suits of law or in equity resulting from patent and copyright infringement concerning the Contractor's performance or products produced under the terms of the contract.

**Inspection and Acceptance**

- a. No equipment, supplies, and/or services received by MoDOT pursuant to a contract shall be deemed accepted until MoDOT has had reasonable opportunity to inspect said equipment, supplies, and/or services.
- b. All equipment, supplies, and/or services which do not comply with the specifications and/or requirements or which are otherwise unacceptable or defective may be rejected. In addition, all equipment, supplies, and/or services which are discovered to be defective or which do not conform to any warranty of the Contractor upon inspection (or at any later time if the defects contained were not reasonably ascertainable upon the initial inspection) may be rejected.
- c. The MHTC reserves the right to return any such rejected shipment at the Contractor's expense for full credit or replacement and to specify a reasonable date by which replacements must be received.
- d. The MHTC's right to reject any unacceptable equipment, supplies, and/or services shall not exclude any other legal, equitable or contractual remedies the MHTC may have.

**Warranty**

- a. The Contractor expressly warrants that all equipment, supplies, and/or services provided shall: (1) conform to each and every specification, drawing, sample or other description which was furnished to or adopted by MoDOT, (2) be fit and sufficient for the purpose expressed in the solicitation documents, (3) be merchantable, (4) be of good materials and workmanship, and (5) be free from defect.
- b. Such warranty shall survive delivery and shall not be deemed waived either by reason of the MHTC's acceptance of or payment for said equipment, supplies, and/or services.

**Status of Independent Contractor**

- a. The Contractor represents itself to be an independent Contractor offering such services to the general public and shall not represent itself or its employees to be an employee of the MHTC. Therefore, the Contractor shall assume all legal and financial responsibility for taxes, FICA, employee fringe benefits, workers' compensation, employee insurance, minimum wage requirements, overtime, etc., and agrees to indemnify, save and hold the MHTC, its officers, agents and employees harmless from and against any and all losses (including attorney fees) and damage of any kind related to such matters.

**Indemnification**

- a. The Offeror shall defend, indemnify and hold harmless the Commission, including its members and department employees, from any claim or liability whether based on a claim for damages to real or personal property or to a person for any matter relating to or arising out of the Offeror's performance of its obligations under this Agreement.
