ADDENDUM 001

REQUEST FOR QUOTATION (RFQ) NUMBER: NE12-62Q-R2

April 17, 2012

The following notes are believed to be of general interest to all potential vendors.

1. In the Scope of Work section of the reference RFQ, there is a paragraph stating:

“Septic waste is subject to the Clean Water Act and must be processed at a sewer treatment plant for disposal. All waste removed from these vaults shall not be disposed of on property the vendor may have permission or permits to spread on, without first going through a proper treatment facility.”

Following a question this afternoon from a vendor, we have learned the following from the Missouri Department of Natural Resources (DNR)...

If a vendor has a land disposal permit, this waste may be disposed of under that permit, without going through a treatment facility, provided the type of waste material generated at the Mineola vaults is a type specifically listed on the permit and will be disposed of on land specifically addressed on the permit.

So, if a vendor has a proper land disposal permit, the requirement to have this material go through a “proper treatment facility” will not apply. We advise checking with your local DNR representative to determine whether any permit you may hold are valid for this type of work.

2. All other requirements and details of the RFQ remain unchanged. The response deadline remains no later than 1:00 PM tomorrow, April 18, 2012.
