







Meetings Planned to Present ‘Reasonable Range’ of Alternative Highway Alignments for U.S. Route 63

Maries, Osage and Phelps Counties – The Missouri Department of Transportation will hold two open-house public meetings to display a reasonable range of alternative highway alignments that are part of an environmental and location study for Route 63 through Osage, Maries, and Phelps Counties.

The meetings are scheduled for Thursday, Oct. 25, at the Vienna Knights of Columbus Hall, 206 Sixth Street, and Tuesday, Oct. 30, at the Westphalia Knights of Columbus Hall, one mile south of the Route 50/63 junction. Both meetings will run from 4 p.m. to 7 p.m., and accessibility accommodations will be available.

MoDOT developed the reasonable range of alternative alignments after evaluating technical, cultural, and environmental data as well as public comment from previous meetings. The reasonable range of alternatives narrows the selection of highway alignments from the preliminary range originally presented during the previous public meetings in spring 2007. Those who are interested in reviewing the alignments or sharing their ideas about the study can attend either meeting at any time between 4-7 p.m. No formal presentations will be made but MoDOT employees will be available to discuss the study and answer questions.




US 63 Location and Environmental Study



“Drop-In” Meeting Planned to Share Emerging Alignments for U.S. Route 63 Environmental and Location Study

JEFFERSON CITY – As part of the U.S. Route 63 Environmental Impact Statement, the Missouri Department of Transportation held public meetings last fall to share a reasonable range of alternative alignments within the study area. Based on technical data and public comment analyzed since that time, the study team has made adjustments and new alignments have emerged at four locations.

The public is invited to a “drop in” open house to discuss these emerging transportation alignments with MoDOT staff on **Thursday, April 10 from 4-6 p.m.** at the American Legion located on Route 63 in Freeburg. Detailed maps of the emerging alignments will be available at the meeting. These maps will also be available on the web at www.modot.org/central by April 4.

Following this “drop in” meeting, the study team will continue to analyze the data collected and a recommended preferred alternative will be available for public comment in Fall 2008.

MoDOT is conducting this environmental and location study of U.S. Route 63 in Osage, Maries and Phelps Counties to evaluate current and potential future transportation needs along a 47-mile stretch of U.S. Route 63, from south of the Route 50/63 junction to just north of Rolla. The study objectives include improving safety, traffic flow and continuity on the north/south corridor.


