

# MoDOT 2008 St. Louis Metro Area Construction Projects

## I-64 RECONSTRUCTION

**I-64 from Ballas Road to Kingshighway.** All lanes and interchanges of I-64 closed from Ballas Road to I-170 from January-December 2008. I-64 reconstruction runs from March 2007 – July 2010.

- I-64 and Hampton Avenue interchange.** Closed late summer 2008 – late spring 2009.

## INTERSTATE HIGHWAYS

- I-44 at Hampton.** Relocate eastern abutment wall to improve sight distance. March 2008 – summer 2008.
- I-44 at Hampton.** Add dual left turn lanes from southbound Hampton to eastbound I-44. March 2008 – winter 2008.
- I-44 at Vandeventer.** Signal interconnect. Complete: summer 2008.
- I-55 from I-70 to Route M.** Install traffic management devices. Complete: summer 2008.
- I-55 at Reavis .** Widening the northbound exit ramp. May 2008 – fall 2008. Periodic lane closures in off-peak.
- I-55 from 4500 S. Broadway to Lindbergh.** Replace and rehabilitate bridges. Will require lane restrictions and may involve total bridge closures. December 2008 – spring 2010.
- I-55 bridge over Meramec.** Bridge painting. November 2008 – January 2009. Few lane closures required.
- I-55 West Outer Road over Rock Creek.** Bridge replacement. May 2008 – summer 2009. Will require a total closure of the roadway.
- I-64 from 21st Street to the Poplar Street Bridge.** Install lighting. Summer 2008 – summer 2009.
- I-64 from I-170 to Sarah.** Install traffic management devices. Complete: summer 2008.
- I-70 North Outer Road at Shady Springs.** New traffic signal. Summer 2008. Possible lane closures during non-peak travel times.
- I-70 at Wentzville Parkway.** Construct new turn lanes and widen ramp. Spring 2008 – fall 2008. Lane closures during non-peak travel times.


## U.S. HIGHWAYS

- Route 40/I-64 at Spirit Blvd.** Construct eastbound ramps. Summer 2008 – late 2008.
- Route 40/I-64.** Construct new eastbound off ramp at Missouri Research Park. Complete: summer 2008. Lane closures during non-peak travel times.
- Route 40/61.** Upgrade Route 40/61 to interstate standards from west of Lake St. Louis Blvd to I-70. Project will eliminate all at-grade crossings and construct a new interchange at Prospect Road. Fall 2007 – fall 2009. Local road closures through the end of the project. Miscellaneous lane closures during non-peak times.
- Route 61/67 and Richardson.** Construct a second left turn and right turn lane on Richardson. April 2008 – winter 2009.
- Route 61/67 over Joachim Creek.** Bridge painting. April 2008 – July 2008.

## STATE NUMBERED HIGHWAYS

- Route 30 over Gravois Creek.** Highway closed for two months between January 2009 – March 2009 to replace a bridge and add turn lanes.
- Route 30 and Geyer Road.** Safety improvement project. Summer 2008 – fall 2008. Periodic lane closures in off-peak.
- Route 30 and Little Brennan.** Constructing dual left turn lanes onto Route 30. April 2008-fall 2008. Lane closures during off-peak hours.
- Route 30 from the Franklin County line to Route B.** Resurfacing. Sept. 2008 – summer 2009. Lane closures.

- Route 50 from Gerald to Route 47.** Rehabilitating pavement. April 2008 – fall 2008.
- Route 61 at McCoy Creek.** Bridge widening and rehabilitating. Winter 2008 – summer 2008. Lane closures during non-peak travel times. Permanent restrictions over weekend.
- Route 67 from New Halls Ferry Road to Route 367.** Installing solar speed limit signs and traffic islands. Summer 2008 – summer 2009.
- Route 67 from I-270 to Route AC (New Halls Ferry Road).** Resurfacing. Summer 2008 – summer 2009.
- Route 67 at Lindsay and Patterson.** Road widening. March 2008 – winter 2008.
- Route 94 from 5th Street to Route B.** Constructing an additional lane, repairing pavement and overlaying asphalt. Fall 2008 – summer 2009. Reduction to one-lane road with flaggers for all pavement repair and asphalt overlay work.
- Route 94 from south of I-64 to south of Route D.** Repairing pavement and overlaying asphalt. Spring 2008 – summer 2008. Reduction to one-lane road with flaggers for all repair and overlay work during non-peak travel times.
- Route 100 from the Franklin/St. Louis County line to Route T.** Repairing and diamond grinding pavement. April 2008 – fall 2008.
- Route 100 from I-44 to South Point Road.** Constructing two new lanes on Route 100. June 2008 – summer 2010.
- Route 100 over Little Boeuf Creek.** Replacing bridge. April 2008 – September 2008. Permanent restrictions.

## STATE LETTERED HIGHWAYS

- Route 109 from Route 100 to Route CC.** Resurfacing. Complete: summer 2008.
- Route 109 from Route 100 to Manchester Road.** Bridge widening, road widening, constructing three roundabouts. Cost share project with Wildwood. Could start as early as summer 2008.
- Route 141 from Route HH (Clayton Road) to north of Conway Road.** Resurfacing. January 2008 – summer 2008.
- Route 340 (Clarkson Road).** Installing sound-walls from north of Route HH (Clayton Road) to south of Kehrs Mill. January 2008 – summer 2008.
- Route 364 east and west of Harvester Road.** Upgrading Route 94 to a limited access roadway with an overpass for Harvester Road and one-way outer roads. Construction continues until fall 2009. Some permanent lane restrictions, lane closures during non-peak hours. Traffic shifts in spring and summer 2008.
- Route H at Riverview, Gimblin and Adelaide.** Reconstructing and interconnecting signals. Complete: summer 2008.
- Route AC (New Halls Ferry Road) from Parker to south of I-270.** Overlaying asphalt. Spring 2008.
- Route BB from Route 30 to Route 21.** Replacing culverts. Complete: fall 2008. Road closures. Permanent restrictions.
- Route BB over Sand Creek.** Rehabilitating bridge. January 2008 – July 2008. Road closures. Permanent restrictions.
- Route HH (Clayton Road) from Kehr's Mill to Baxter.** Widening road to three lanes. Completed: late summer 2008. Permanent restrictions.
- Route D from Callaway Fork Road west 1.2 miles.** Constructing shoulders. Summer 2008. Reduction to one-lane road with flaggers during non-peak travel times.

**Please Note:** This map shows only major construction projects in the St. Louis metro area. Construction and maintenance work will occur on other roadways throughout the area. Many projects will include lane closures, and delays can be expected any time during the duration of a project. Completion dates are subject to change.





Get an **EDGE**

As you travel through the St. Louis region, get the latest information on traffic patterns, construction and how to get where you are going, especially as the I-64 reconstruction process continues. Work zones can be an inconvenience, but they mean MoDOT is making the roads **SMOOTHER** and **SAFER** for you as **SOON** as possible. Here are some tools you can use to get an edge on travel as you drive around St. Louis.



MoDOT's new on-line Traveler Information Map gives you all the information you need to know about travel throughout Missouri. Find work-zone information and weather related road conditions in a single location on [www.modot.org](http://www.modot.org). The map uses icons for work zones, road closures, incidents, flood and winter road conditions. Additionally, electronic message boards along Interstate 70 and Interstate 44 give drivers information on scheduled road closings, road construction, crashes and hazardous or uncommon road conditions. The police can also post Amber or SARA Alerts for missing children. For the latest information on road closings and road work around Missouri, trust the information on the Traveler Information Map.



Gateway Guide is a transportation communications network that helps reduce traffic congestion and improves safety throughout the St. Louis metropolitan region. The program uses real-time traffic information to help minimize traffic delays due to incidents, work zones and the rising number of vehicles on area highways.

Gateway Guide now has more cameras, and gives more information to travelers in the area, including information on traffic speeds and travel times posted on overhead message boards along interstates. Drivers can use this information to make intelligent decisions about which routes to use to avoid construction and congestion. They can also use this information to make last minute changes based on the latest traffic information.



Gateway Guide is enhanced by a free 511 service throughout St. Louis on most cellular phone and many home service providers. 511 gives travelers real-time updates on incidents and traffic conditions regional interstates around the clock. For phones which do not have 511 service activated by the carrier, dial 1-877-478-5511 (4STL511). Although the call is free, carrier minute charges may still apply. This web-based travel information tool helps motorists find alternative routes around highway and ramp closures in St. Louis City and St. Louis County, especially along the I-64 reconstruction project. Located at [www.modot.org/stlouis/](http://www.modot.org/stlouis/), Map My Trip provides simple, street-by-street alternate routes when you provide your starting point and destination. Information on Map My Trip changes regularly – we constantly add new ramp or road closures and remove those that have reopened.
